I object to the proposal in the education bill 2024. 1. It will be included in the law that homeschooling must be "in the best interest" of the child.

who decides on what is in the best interest of the child? Isn't that the job and right of a parent?! What is the criteria for determining what's best? Could they reject the application and then perhaps the child will be forced to go to school against the parent will? This is the potential. If this part of the bill goes through, parental rights will be utterly violated. Mums will be co-parenting with the government and it will be harder to homeschool.

2. Complete removal of provisional registration

If a child is of school age and they are experiencing bullying or some sort of trauma at school, parents will not legally be able to get them out until the full registration is complete.

Appreciate if you can withdraw this bill as it does not serve Australians, parents and children.
