**Submitter Comments:**

Parents should be able to choose a curriculum that works for their child. The National Curriculum is designed for large classrooms of children, not for a personalized teaching environment. The current registration and reporting system are working well, there is no need to change it. Instead of making things more prescriptive for homeschooling families, perhaps the Government should review the school system and find out why so many parents are opting to home-school their children. It is not the government's or the public service's role to decide what is best for children; it is the parents' (or caregivers') role. The exception would be where there is proven abuse or neglect. This does not relate to the great majority of children, who live in secure family situations. Furthermore, it has nothing to do with curriculum.
