As a mother who has chosen the homeschooling pathway to educate my child, I feel that the government needs to hear our voices and seriously consider our concerns with the current Austrlian Cirruclum and understand why so many of us have made this decision. The following points that I am addressing are just some of the reasons why I feel the committee needs to take more time in consulting the homeschooling community before making any changes.1.
