I am writing to you about the Education (General Provisions) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2024 (the Bill).

This will really impact the rights and freedoms of my family. I do not think we should have to give proof that we need to be homeschooled or have to follow only the Australian Curriculum. Homeschooling allows me to:

1. Focus on my interests – homeschooling allows me to do my interests and work schoolwork around them instead of being at a desk 9am till 3pm
2. Learn different languages – my local schools only offer a couple of language options. As a homeschool I can do whatever languages I want to do
3. Meet new people – I meet people of all ages and backgrounds. With my home school group, I even visited an age care facility and talked to them about their life last week
4. Have access to lots of resources – I have access to many different resources so can choose the best for my learning.
5. Go to Tafe earlier – I would like to go to Tafe once I am 14/15 so that I can start learning a trade and get a qualification. If I was in mainstream school I would have less options for this.
6. Be a higher grade if you are good enough – I currently work at grade 6/7 in maths and 6/7 in English! I couldn't do this in mainstream.
