## Dear Committee Members,

I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposed changes in Homeschooling legislation, particularly the requirement to follow a specific Curriculum. As a homeschooling parent, I firmly believe that these changes would undermine the very reasons why many families, including mine, have chosen Homeschooling as the preferred mode of education for our children.

The essence of homeschooling lies in the freedom it affords children to learn in a manner that aligns with their individual interests, abilities, and learning styles. By imposing a mandated curriculum, these proposed changes would impede my children's autonomy and hinder their ability to pursue education in a way that best suits their needs.

Home Education works for us because our 8yo is above their grade level for math according to the curriculum but not in reading, currently we are able to individually tailor their learning to focus more on reading. So that diversity of skill across subjects is exactly why school and the standard curriculum would not work, learning for them HAS to be individualised to cater to their needs and skills.

With multiple children at different levels at different times enforcing the curriculum to be followed will mean our children will not have the same personalised education we can currently provide for them.

One of the primary motivations for homeschooling is to provide our children with a personalized learning experience that fosters their intellectual curiosity and allows them to learn at their own pace.

These new regulations threaten to restrict this flexibility and stifle their natural inclination to explore and discover the world around them.

Furthermore, enforcing a standardized curriculum fails to recognize the diverse interests and talents of homeschooling students. It overlooks the fact that every child is unique and may thrive in different subject areas or learning environments.

By imposing rigid educational requirements, we risk depriving our children of the opportunity to pursue their passions and develop their full potential.

In essence, these proposed changes would not only undermine the fundamental principles of homeschooling but also limit my children's ability to learn and grow in a way that honors their individuality and creativity.

As a homeschooling parent deeply invested in my children's education, I urge the committee to reconsider these restrictive measures and instead focus on supporting families in providing a rich and diverse educational experience tailored to the needs of each child.

Lastly I'm concerned that the legislation has been introduced without proper consultation with current home educating families. I feel that I and my family or the Qld home education community have not been represented for adequately or at all in the second round of consultation because no one asked who I wanted as a consultation representative in light of

there being NO official association, I did not even receive any offical information about these changes which is **unacceptable** because we are currently registered under Home Education Qld. I hope that you will take my feedback into consideration. For education to be inclusive of all students, I believe it is important to understand the reasoning behind the education decisions of the families who struggle the most to fit into mainstream education.
