SUBMISSION regarding Public Health and Other Legislation (Further Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Act 2021 -

The current legislation, which is under discussion for extension, unlawfully attempts to override the Biosecurity Act of 2015.

I strongly object to the unnecessary extension.

The initial Act already denied the people of Queensland their inalienable rights from the Australian Constitution, as well as international laws.

The original declaration of a State of Emergency in Queensland was totally unfounded and not demonstrably verifiable.

In 2020, the overall death rate in most countries seems to have been very similar to previous years. The only difference is that anyone who happened to supposedly die with COVID19 (this is even disputable as PCR tests are not fully reliable) was statistically counted as dying FROM this illness. There is also the fact (which can be checked) that the vast majority of supposed CV deaths occurred in people with, on average, 2.5 other major health issues.

If we were experiencing a real pandemic, the situation would have been very different.

Prior to 2020, in the event of a pandemic the World Health Organisation declared that only ill people (those with actual symptoms of a disease) should be quarantined. You need to ask yourself, why the sudden change?

Many studies show that mask wearing by healthy people is of no use in decreasing the likelihood of their infection by a respiratory virus. Also, a mask wearer is liable to get sick from constantly re-breathing bacteria which their body is trying to exhale.

It is very wrong for a government to mandate mask wearing.
