Public Health and Other Legislation (Further Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Bill 2021

On 16 June 2021, the Minister for Health and Ambulance Services, the Hon Yvette D'Ath MP, introduced the Public Health and Other Legislation (Further Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Bill 2021 (Bill) into the Queensland Parliament. On 18 June 2021, the Bill was referred to the Economics and Governance Committee for its consideration and report to the Parliament by 6 August 2021.

Hereby object to all of the following bill and it's amendments as these amendments severely restrict my liberties and rights as a free and sovereign being. I am referring to the following specific bill found at this website:

I object specifically to the following amendments:

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT AMENDMENTS:

Amendments to the Public Health Act have supported Queensland's approach to managing the health risks associated with COVID-19. Among other things, the amendments:

1•increase powers for emergency officers and the Chief Health Officer to limit, or respond to, the spread of COVID-19 in Queensland, including by issuing directions to require physical distancing, restrict movement and gatherings, require persons to quarantine or self-isolate and implement other containment measures;

2•authorise the sharing of confidential information for contact tracing;

3•encourage compliance with quarantine requirements, border restrictions and other public health directions by providing appropriate penalties for contraventions;

4•increase the period for which a regulation may extend a declared public health emergency from seven to 90 days;

5 and" This is the bill that also removes your home cars and pets.

We the people of Queensland need to have our rights fully restored so we can live a peaceful, productive and happy life.
