Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to express my opposition to the Queensland Government's proposed extension of emergency powers through the Public Health and Other Legislation (Further Extension of Expiring Provisions) Amendment Bill 2021.

There is NO emergency! This "virus" has never been isolated, has an over 99.97% recovery rate (better than influenza) and the figures of death worldwide were an absolute fabrication. Evidence of this can be found on the US Centre for Disease Control's own website. The PCR tests are not accurate, and have been set to give many false positives. Therefore, any extension of the already unconstitutional state of emergency powers must not be considered.
