## Dear EGC,

Our view is that all currently operating mines and quarries should be forced to pay an annual levy to ensure that:

- 1. Existing mining sites are cleaned up.
- 2. Closed mining sites have some kind of financial assistance which will increase over time.
- 3. Clearly taxpayers should not be forced to pay for the previous dividend payments that a few shareholders received, when it is these shareholders who should have paid.
- 4. If the mine is closed than all previous directors and shareholders, should be levied to pay something.
  - For example previous Mt Morgan directors and shareholders be levied a small (tax deductable) amount, depending on the amount of dividends paid.
  - These dividends should (morally) have been partially diverted into an ECO-Fund.
  - Even if the levy could not be made compulsory, then it still should be made.

For currently operating mines, the amount of the levy should be set according to:

- 1. The amount of material previously mined, and
- 2. The amount that is still to be mined, and
- 3. The depth of the hole, and
- 4. The proximity to residential areas.

When the mine or quarry is within a 1000m distance of major facilities or buildings, the operator be required to provide an annual report assessing all possible damage.

(FYI: The standard Key Resource Area Separation Zone distances are 500m and 1000m.)

For example, the Mt Coot-tha Quarry Resource Blasting and Processing Area (RPA), is only 100m from the important QLD 60-inch (1.6 metre) water-grid pipeline, yet the quarry has never conducted any blast vibration monitoring on the pipeline. As the pipeline passes through the Botanical Gardens and the Mt Coot-tha residential suburb, it would be extremely disruptive if any repairs were needed.

The new proposed Mt Coot-tha ZipLine elevated walkway will start approximately 100m from the RPA.

We make this submission on behalf of all the Mt Coot-tha Residents.
