

NOTICE OF ACCEPTANCE

Enforceable undertaking under the Occupational Health and Safety Act 1991 (the Act). Concare has accepted a court-enforceable undertaking from the Telstra Corporation Limited (Telstra) to improve its occupational safety after an alleged failure to observe its duties under federal workplace safety laws.

The enforceable undertaking follows an investigation by Comcare into two incidents which occurred in early 2008. In the first incident, a vision investigat member of the public fell into a Telstra manhole while it was open, unguarded, and in use by two sub-contractors to Telstra. The individual suffered fractured ribs and a incerated thigh. Although Telstra was informed of this incident, the individual's wife again observed the same pit to be open, unguarded, and in use by another Telstra subcontractor only 3 weeks later.

Comcare's investigation found that Telstin had breached section 17 of the Act by failing to take all reasonably practicable steps to ensure that persons at or near a workplace under its control who are not its employees or control who are not its employees or control are not exposed to risk to their health or safety arising from the conduct of its undertaking.

The undertaking is a legally enforceable commitment by Telsura to achieve more than minimum compliance with the Act.

Telsum has taken already steps to improve its existing occupational health and safety practices. In addition, Telstra will engage with the Monash University Accident Research Centre on a series of projects which will increase the safety of its workplaces and operations, and to improve contractor management processes, the guarding of pits, and provision of information to the public.



Federal funds for **Kimberley** playgroup



A PLAYGROUP for Indigenous children and their parents will help build stronger families in Balgo, in Western Australia's Kimberley region, according to Federal Indigenous Affairs Minister Jenny Macklin.

She said the Government had committed up to \$240,000 over three years to build on the work the Balgo community had already done to establish their playgroup.

Ms Macklin announced the funding after a visit to the remote community.

"Mothers in Balgo told me how important having a local playgroup was for them and their babies. Playgroups are fun, and help children develop social, emotional, physical and cognitive skills," she said.

"Local children will be able to learn through play-based early childhood development activities, including music and singing, imaginative play, art and craft, word games, story telling, outdoor and free play.

Importantly, the playgroup in Balgo also gives parents, grandparents, and carers the opportunity to establish important social and support networks to help improve their parenting techniques.

"We are working with the local community and across government to find the most suitable space for the playgroup.

The playgroup will also have links to other government agencies.


