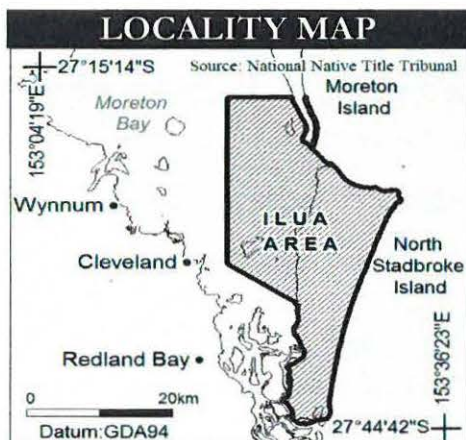

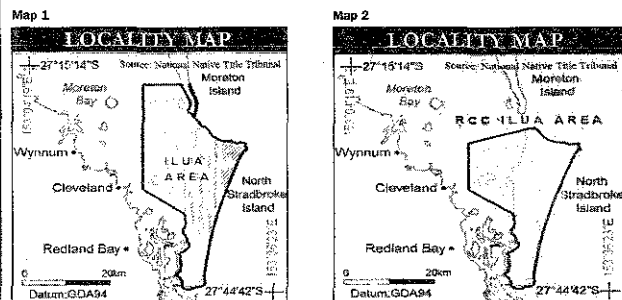

The proposed ILUA with Redland City Council covers all of the lands and waters, depicted on the map shown as **Map 2** in this notice ("RCC ILUA Area"), and includes part of the lands and waters the subject of the two applications brought on behalf of the Quandamooka People.

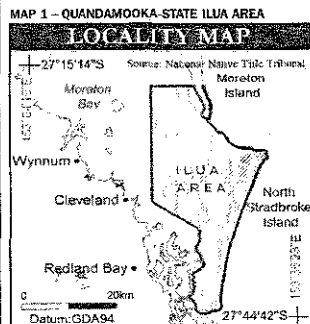

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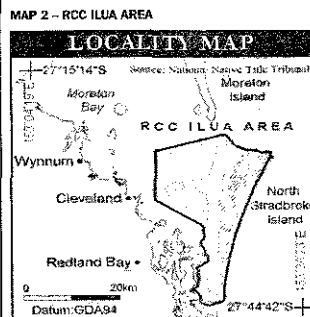

HAVING survived the recent Australia versus New Zealand Rugby League test match, Brisbane Broncos and Australian player Sam Thaiday spent a Saturday this month dodging boomerangs.

He was a special guest at the North Stradbroke Island Healthy Community day, just off Brisbane, where he hosted and judged the kids' boomerang-throwing competition.

The event, organised by the Institute for Urban Indigenous Health (IUIH) and Straddie's Yulu-Burri-Ba Health Service, attracted more than 250 people, mostly children, throughout the day.

The day before Mother's Day, the healthy community event was in honour of Stradbroke Island mothers,

and for them there was massage and a foot scrub station. But the event was mainly for the kids, with a jumping castle and rock climbing wall for the youngsters and two Zumba instructors who proved a hit with the teenage girls, in

particular, who krumped and free-styled to Latin and hip-hop beats.

Event organiser and co-ordinator of the IUIH Tackling Smoking and Healthy Lifestyle team lan Lacey said the day demonstrated to North

Stradbroke Island Murriss that 'health isn't all about doctors and medicine'.

"Our people need to know that there is plenty that we can do for ourselves and our families to close the gap," he told the *Koori Mail*.

"The event on North Stradbroke was all about helping our mob understand that good healthy eating, more exercise and quitting the durrries (smokes) will lengthen our lives and close the gap quicker than any government can."

With sponsorship from the Australian Government's Live Longer! Campaign, the Healthy Community Day was one of dozens being held in communities across Australia aimed at celebrating what is good and healthy in the community and providing an opportunity for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to learn more about improving their health and well-being.

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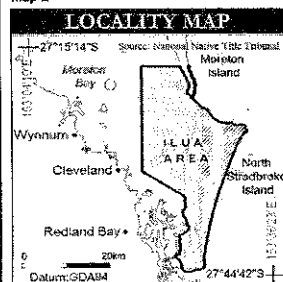
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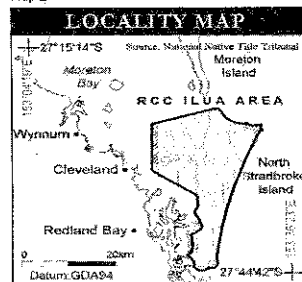

Federal funds for Kimberley playgroup



A PLAYGROUP for Indigenous children and their parents will help build stronger families in Balgo, in Western Australia's Kimberley region, according to Federal Indigenous Affairs Minister Jenny Macklin.

She said the Government had committed up to \$240,000 over three years to build on the work the Balgo community had already done to establish their playgroup.

Ms Macklin announced the funding after a visit to the remote community.

"Mothers in Balgo told me how important having a local playgroup was for them and their babies. Playgroups are fun, and help children develop social, emotional, physical and cognitive skills," she said.

"Local children will be able to learn through play-based early childhood development activities, including music and singing, imaginative play, art and craft, word games, story telling, outdoor and free play.

"Importantly, the playgroup in Balgo also gives parents, grandparents, and carers the opportunity to establish important social and

support networks to help improve their parenting techniques.

"We are working with the local community and across government to find the most suitable space for the playgroup."

The playgroup will also have links to other government agencies.

The funding will help support playgroup staff, who will work to encourage families to access other community services such as community health centres, and will also help provide the playgroup with more toys, books and equipment.

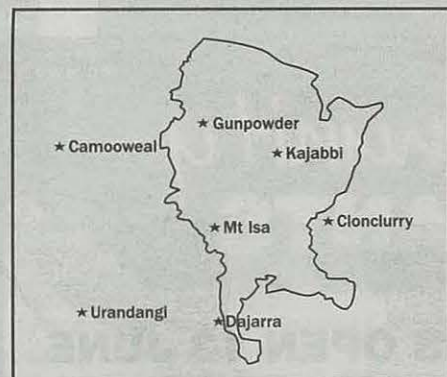

The agreements give effect to the Stanbrooke Settlement Proposal accepted by the Kalkadoon People at a meeting held on 20 February 2011.

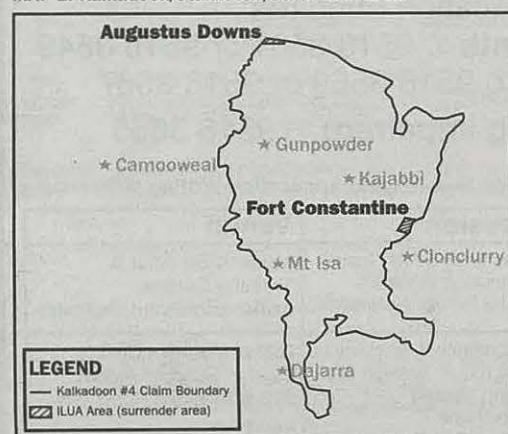

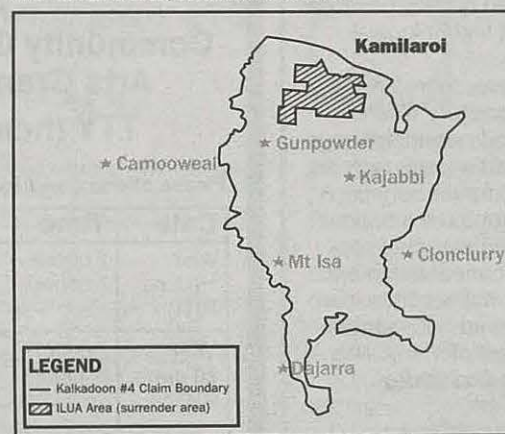

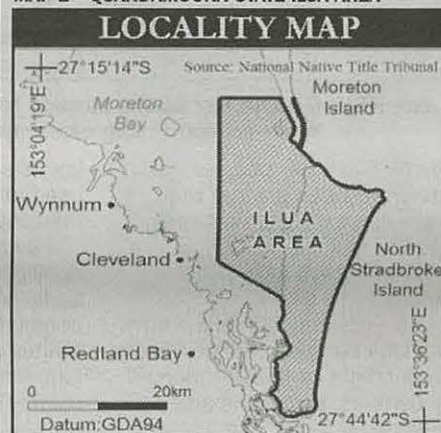

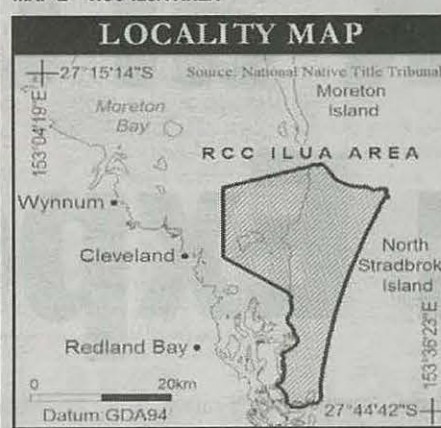

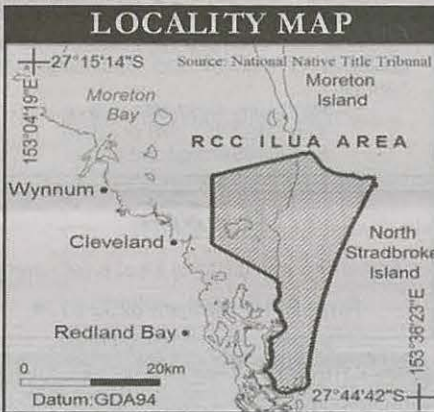
