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Defeat Jackie Trad's Abortion Bill

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Abortion is an ethical grey area, not about right of choice but irresponsible choices with the exception of clear endangerment to the mother's life. It is a subtle form of genocide sponsored under the notions of rights and freedoms of individuals based on a socially implosive welfare society. Responsibility is not taught but undermined as politically incorrect. Logic, responsibility and rational choices are today's illegitimate children. As above, this is consistent with moral responsibility so long as conscientious doctors are practicing freedom without repercussion.
