My name is Mrs Dana Marie Alfred.

As a woman and mother, I strongly oppose Labor's Termination of Pregnancy Bill 2018.

This bill, written intentionally to increase abortion rates, acts against the best interests of women, children and families. Wherever abortion rates rise, so to do female suicide rates. China, with the world's most restrictive family planning policies, is the only country in the world where female suicides are greater in number than male suicides.

This bill goes against the interests of doctors and nurses at the forefront of women's health care. Removing conscientious objection from health care professionals removes safety and morality from practice. It removes the ability of some doctors to continue practising and will inhibit interest in the study of medicine.
