I hope that the committee will strongly recommend MPs vote against independent MP for Cairns, Rob Pyne's Abortion Law Reform Amendment Bill 2016.

This bill allows for abortion up until the day of birth and recognises no legal right of conscientious objection to permit doctors, nurses and other medical staff to opt-out of performing abortions.

After similar legislation was passed in Victoria in 2008, medical staff were left severely traumatised after being ordered to kill unborn babies by their employers.
