Submission to The Parliamentary Committee Overseeing the Proposed Bill
to Change the Law in Queensland in Regard to Abortion

Rob Pyne's Bill to decriminalise abortion is an abrogation of the Law. Every Law which sets out to destroy life is a step into a violent and chaotic society.

Every civil society must promote Laws which uphold life. Everyone must have the right to life because all rights flow from this very point. To steal someone's life in an arbitrary manner is to destroy the very essence of what is at the basis of a civilised society.

The ridiculous scenario put forward by Rob Pyne highlights further abominations, such as those I will mention here: Why not take the life of politicians who vote with Rob Pyne – we could make it pro-choice so that people had the option or not.

The reality is, if everyone has not got the Right to Life (from conception to natural death), then no-one has. We are killing the generation which is supposed to replace us. These people who Rob Pyne proposes to kill are future workers, carers, husbands, wives and tax payers.

We are living at a time in history where there seems to be no end to domestic violence. At present we are looking to the state to assist in promoting peace and harmony in the family while in reality we have politicians declaring war on the most vulnerable. This is domestic violence at its worst – that is killing the very product of a relationship which is trying to create unity in the most simplest form, 'The Family', the number one building block of every human civilisation.

It is therefore urgently necessary for the future of society and the development of a sound democracy, to rediscover those essential and innate human and moral values which flow from the very truth of the human being and express and safeguard the dignity of the person - Values which no individual, no majority, and no state can ever create, modify, or destroy, but must only acknowledge, respect and promote.
