Submission to Abortion Law Reform (Women's Right to Choose) Amendment Bill 2016 and Inquiry into laws governing termination of pregnancy in Queensland

I support Abortion Law Reform and ask the Queensland Parliament to pass the Abortion Law Reform (Woman's Right to Choose) Amendment Bill 2016.

I am deeply concerned that doctors and the women they are assisting can be prosecuted under Queensland's antiquated abortion legislation. What is even more disturbing is that women and their partner's have been prosecuted under these laws.

Women's decisions about their reproductive health are an important matter to be determined between them and their doctor. Women should be able to access abortions without fear of criminal prosecution. Fetal anomaly is not a reason supported by the current legislative settings in Queensland.
