Dear Health Committee, It is with some degree of urgency that I type of my concern about an upcoming bill that is tabled to be addressed in parliament. Mr Pyne is tabling yet another bill on abortion legislation. He has already submitted previous bills which have not been completely considered and this new one is a clear strategy to truncate the processes and consideration of both. Proper due consideration and debate needs to be followed for both bills separately in line with the long established principles of Qld Government parliamentary processes.

The root of my concern though about this policy is that it is set to remove all restrictions from abortion, restrictions that manage the reasons surrounding, that govern at what point one may occur and in what circumstances as well as paving the way for abortions in the future that can hinge on genetic, gender, ethical and other matters.

At the last election, both sides of parliament ALP and LNP made commitments not to change abortion law, and yet now there is consideration of changes occurring without even consulting the public. This is in spite of significant surveys and studies detailing that the general public are satisfied with the current laws and are uncomfortable with the possibility of what could be called open slather abortion as you wish.

Human life is precious and everyone has a right to protect the sanctity of human life. The unborn and young are unique in that they do not have a voice that they can independently stand up for themselves, thus we are impelled to stand in the gap and be their voice. Scientific evidence, ultra sounds and so on have comprehensively detailed the aliveness of a baby in the womb from the time of conception. Regardless of the surrounding circumstances of the mother's choices, the fact is that a young life is being terminated when every abortion occurs. This billis even placing on the table that these little lives can even be terminated right up to near birth. If you have ever read or viewed vision of the methods used for abortion, particularly late term ones, you would be sickened, horrified and appalled. If such methods were used on infants outside the womb, it would be classed as torturous murder and public outrage would occur. In conclusion, I ask you to act on the behalf of not just Qld voters who do not want changes but more importantly the unborn. We all were once unborn infants at one stage and I am so thankful my parents carried me to full term as I am sure you would be.
