Had she chosen to have an abortion, again, I would not be alive to write to you today, nor would my 3 beautiful children be alive today.

My point is that abortion in all its forms, does not just affect 1 life, it affects generations.

Women who do not have the option of having an abortion may still choose to keep their child, after they have given birth.

I would also like the committee to reject and or oppose, the option for women to perform abortions at home. Women who may choose this option are more likely to be less informed or completely uninformed about other options that are open to them. Also these "women" are more likely to be young vulnerable girls, who have made a poor decision, rather than a fully informed and educated woman.
