The amended bill proposes that the "Benefits of Bill: The Bill will repeal outdated laws that can criminalise women and doctors for a basic human right and a medical procedure."


However, if you look up the 'basic human rights'

- it's foundational articles are, in particular relating to abortion topics:

- **Article 3.** Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.
- **Article 5.** No one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment.

Article 6. Everyone has the right to recognition everywhere as a person before the law. Nowhere could I find in the 'universal human rights' the right to murder another human being, whether in or out of the womb.

When a human egg is fertilized by a human sperm, they create a human baby/offspring — that offspring — whether inside or outside the womb — is human. When a baby/fetus/embryo is aborted/murdered they are DENIED their basic human right to life, DENIED their basic human right to not be subjected to torture or cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment (see image outlining a basic abortion procedure, which is clearly tortuous, cruel and inhuman treatment) and this proposed bill is DENYING these humans/babies/foetuses the right to recognition as a person before the law.
