Submission

I do not want this amendment to go through because:

1. I do not agree with discrimination, segregation or penalties for parents and children who do not vaccinate.
2. I am opposed to this bill because it is discriminating against non-vaccinating families, when vaccinated families continue to contract the diseases for which they have been vaccinated against.
3. This bill is unethical and aims to bully public compliance with fear, rather than education.
4. Parents who decide not to vaccinate are educated, and make informed decisions.
5. The “science” used to support such a proposal is often biased, one-sided and incorrectly stated.
6. Children with leaky guts / digestive problems are at a huge risk of side-effects from vaccinations and this is poorly understood. Research into this area is under-funded at best or ignored/not acknowledged at worst.
7. Funding for research is primarily from an industry that needs to continue vaccinations and therefore is subject to bias and misuse
8. The media has weighed into the matter with highly biased reporting and has a financial interest in the outcome – Rupert Murdoch has investments in a pharmaceutical company that will significantly benefit from a change in policy – this bill smacks of corruption and corporate power pushing into government policy. The government should never mandate medical policy for it’s people – that should always be an individual choice. Particularly, as the current medical model is biased and one sided – mainly due to the corporate power of very large pharmaceutical companies and their impact into research and policy. At the very least, the government should recognise the distrust by the public of decisions that appear are heavily promoted by corporate interests with financial interest.
9. Investigations into the impact of increasing whooping cough have been extremely biased. Reporting ignores the relationship between the increase in whooping cough and the increase of children born to mothers with vaccinated immunity rather than natural immunity. There has been considerable and incorrect fear mongering on this topic in the media and the government appears to be bowing to biased media pressure. There has been considerable misrepresentation as to those effected – the majority already having been vaccinated not the other way around!
10. Vaccines are given at too young an age. Prior to one year of age, a child does not have a suitably formed immune systems to properly process the vaccinations.
11. I will never support a government that implements this policy. I will not comply. I will not use daycare.
