Dear Committee.

My name is Matt, I have lived in Queensland for the last thirty years.

Babies, are literally the most vulnerable member of our society. They have no capacity to care for themselves and rely upon the mature around them for nurturing. Nevertheless, world history has testified to the frequency of children being harmed and neglected at the hands of adults.
