# Queensland Legislative Assemble Health and Environment Committee Inquiry

Submission into the provision of: Primary and allied health care; the private health care system

Thank you for the opportunity to provide this Submission as an active clinician, health reform advocate, and academic member of every federal Primary Care Reform Steering Committee or taskforce since 2010.

The Committee is right to investigate the malalignment of our current health care system with contemporary community need, and explore much more appropriate system integration between the largely state-funded acute care system, and the primarily Commonwealth and user-pays funded primary care system. The impact of the lack of articulation between both systems has been a long-running and fundamental weakness in our otherwise world-class health care system, and has been highlighted repeatedly by Aged Care and Mental Health Commissions, recent Productivity and Commonwealth reform reviews, and National Health Reform Agreements themselves.

Given the shortness of time to prepare submissions, I have highlighted a small number of papers which may inform the Committee, and provide a trigger for discussion and debate.

I am happy to provide further depth if of use post-Christmas.
