To whom it may concern,

Since the start of the pandemic there were many unknowns and now it appears the government's response to this issue was disproportionate to the level of risk. Nobody is to blame we were dealing with unknowns.

I wish to submit the following points all which are backed up by research and studies from the CDC and other government web sites. I can provide a comprehensive list if required.

There is now no longer an emergency so there is no reason to extend a state of emergency

- The lethality of the virus is far lower than models first suggested – the death rate is 0.03% and there are now at least three triple therapies (eg zinc, ivermectin and antibiotics) should it move to the lungs as what happens in elderly people
- The current death rate is less than previous years of the flu season
- The test is very unreliable, and, in some cases, false positives can be as high as 90% with empty tests, coke, fruit, etc testing positive
- Infections are being labelled as “cases” which is incorrect, a case is an infection that has led to illness requiring hospitalisation – hence a hospital “case”
- Mask studies show they have no effect on virus transmission and have many side effects like CO2 buildup that in younger children can cause brain damage and a greater chance of getting bacterial pneumonia as was the case in the Spanish flu
- Asymptomatic transmission is close to zero as proven by a recent Chinese study of 10 million people so there is absolutely no point in restricting healthy people in anyway
- A recent study estimates the costs of lockdowns are more than ten times the benefits (and note from the above locking up healthy people is pointless and leads to unwanted side effects that effect physical and mental health)
- Countries that did not lock down are now showing to have more favourable statistics than countries that locked down
- All course mortality for previous five years in most countries shows this year is not significantly different to any other year hence it is just labelling things as Covid when they may have been something else OR the Covid virus won out against other competing flu or cold virus

With so much new information available this all needs to be debated and collect lessons learned etc.

Certainly, with the current statistics and what we know now, a pandemic would never have been called in the first place. The optimal outcome would be to stop all tests and open up the economy and remove all restrictions. The pandemic ended some time ago now all we have is a “case demic” and all these “cases” do not equate to visits to the ICU and in any case, there are treatments now like Ivermectin which has a 100 percent success rate and very cheap. This must be done as soon as possible.

I am from NSW however all my family live in Queensland so this does affect me too. Thank you for considering my submission.
