Dear Sirs,

I wish to express in the strongest possible terms my objection to the manner in which the COVID issue has been handled. The draconian measures implemented do NOT coincide with the evidence that has emerged as the year has progressed. I do not agree that the terms should be extended.

There are many highly-credentialed academics, many tenured in the most prestigious universities globally, who provide scientific evidence that is different from that which Australian health authorities are accessing. What was apparently evidence-based science in January 2020 when the pandemic was declared, no longer holds. This is evident in relation to the way in which the rt-PCR test is being implemented. Clearly, the cycle threshold is capable of generating false data and it is this false data that has driven the draconian shutdowns and other measures that are adversely impacting other aspects of the health of Australian citizens.
