Tobacco and Other Smoking Products (Dismantling Illegal Trade) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2025

Clause 17: Amendment of s 197 (Seizing evidence at a place that may be entered without consent or a warrant)

(2) Also, the authorised person may seize a thing **in** the place if the authorised person reasonably believes the thing is compromised goods.

Should the word "in" be replaced with "at" for consistency and accuracy?

Clause 21 Insertion of new s 205BA

205BA Forfeiture of compromised goods

- (1) The chief executive may decide a seized thing is forfeited to the State if the chief executive is satisfied—
 - (a) the thing is compromised goods; and
 - (b) either-
 - (i) a relevant product under section 205(6) was present at the place in which the thing was seized and has been forfeited under section 205; or
 - (ii) vaping goods were present at the place in which the thing was seized and have been forfeited under section 205B.
- (2) The chief executive is not required to provide procedural fairness in making the decision.

As compromised goods do not include illicit tobacco or illicit nicotine products themselves, clarification is sought on the following:

Will a separate forfeiture decision be required for compromised

goods?

- Can a forfeiture decision relating to compromised goods be issued together with a forfeiture decision for prohibited products (illicit tobacco/illicit nicotine)?
- Alternatively, must the forfeiture decision for compromised goods wait until the decision for prohibited products has been served?

Clause 26 Insertion of new pt 11, div 4A, sdiv 3 Relevant Lessors

209CA Definitions for subdivision

In this subdivision— lease, in relation to premises, includes any right to occupy the premises.

premises means any of the following-

- (a) a retail outlet;
- (b) a wholesale outlet;
- (c) premises at which illicit tobacco or illicit nicotine products are available for sale by retail or wholesale.

The current definition does not explicitly include storage sheds or other places where illicit tobacco or illicit nicotine products are stored but not sold.

Clarification is needed on whether such storage-only premises are intended to be covered.
