The impact of having a parent living away for 7 days at a time then arriving home tired and cranky and wanting to assume their role in the family just doesn't work. As the other partner and the family have become used to living as a unit of 1 parent and the children and have developed a system of coping and working together as a complete family unit. They will miss the other parent but will be glad to see them head off again to get over their disruptive coming and going.
