We are **good custodians** of the land as we expect our children and grandchildren to be able to carry on with these properties and earn a successful living. We hope our grandchildren will be able to continue in this industry but are fearful that they may not have the opportunity with the continued red tape and blame that is being imposed on the people in this industry.
- It seems unfair that there is no allocation of blame or legislation to control the runoff and pollution from the numerous households and development in towns and cities along the coast.

- I thought this government was to be seen as being involved in support of rural communities. This legislation will **cause** a further **decline in rural and remote towns**.
- I am disappointed that the scientific views are not being taken into consideration when trying to protect the reef. Emotive responses and media hype seem to be the basis for any legislation concerning the agricultural industry. Evidence of this was the live export debacle. It is happening again with the reef issue.
- We are to be excused from thinking that we are being targeted as environmental scapegoats when the Vegetation Management Laws were imposed in the same manner- lack of true consultation and limited time frame.
