As Australian Citizens we value our safety. Our Constitution as the Highest Law has set clear Precedent as to how all we should ensure our safety, one such key Constitutional Precedent is:

Section 44(i) of the Australian Constitution prevents individuals with dual citizenship from being elected to or sitting in the Federal Parliament. This clause disqualifies anyone who is under any acknowledgment of allegiance, obedience, or adherence to a foreign power, or is a subject or a citizen of a foreign power.

In accordance with this Precedent at the highest of standards and levels in our nation my suggestion is that it be applied to all legislation that defines who in Queensland can legally be in the possession of or have access to a firearm (of any sort).
Namely, anyone who knowingly has dual (or multiple) Citizenship should not be allowed to possess or have access to a firearm in Australia for any reasons, be they sporting, recreational or professional (occupational).

Reiterating that this is fully consistent with the aforementioned Constitutionally defined Precedent that ensures safety via loyalty.

Based on the goals listed in this current process here, resulting from the terrorist attack in Bondi, it is my sincerest opinion that this Constitutional Precedent and application of its justification (logic) shall definitely help prevent terrorism in the future here in Australia.
