To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to request consideration of reforms that would make Category H firearms more reasonably accessible to appropriately licensed recreational shooters on private land in Queensland.

At present, access to Category H firearms is largely limited to specific occupational or club-based purposes. I believe there is scope to broaden lawful access for responsible adults who wish to engage in recreational target shooting on private property, provided that all existing – and any newly imposed – Queensland Government regulations remain in place.

I fully support the continuation of strict licensing requirements, including background checks, mental health assessments, mandatory safety training, secure storage standards, and responsible use conditions. My request is not for reduced regulation, but for fairer access for law-abiding citizens who are willing to comply with all legal obligations.

Allowing vetted and licensed individuals to use Category H firearms recreationally on private land would not undermine public safety. Rather, it would acknowledge the proven record of responsible firearm ownership in Queensland while providing a practical and regulated pathway for enthusiasts outside of club environments.

I respectfully ask that the Government consider reviewing current restrictions with a view to creating a balanced framework that supports both community safety and the legitimate interests of responsible recreational shooters.
