I would like to submit for your consideration the following.

Not introducing firearm cap limits.

As a recreational hunter. Target shooter. Collector. And a person that assists local farmers with feral animal control.

Having capped limits, of even 10 firearms as in other states will reduce my ability to partake in these activities effectively.

When targeting feral animals from rabbit and hare to foxes, wild dogs, pigs, deer and scrub cattle (large bovine) A shooter will need a large variety of firearms to complete these tasks effectively and humanely. Rifles set up for short range hunting. Night hunting. Longer range hunting. Shotguns for various tasks.

As a target shooter. Many different firearms and calibers are needed for individual disciplines. Rimfire match, centerfire match. Long range match. Metallic silhouette matches. Military rifle matches.

As a collector. Firearms of antique history will never be able to be replaced or remade. Firearms of limited production, not to be produced again. firearms of sentimental value to be passed down to the next generation of family.

All of these factors make having capped limits unworkable. This will impact on my way of life, hobbies and ability to assist farmers with feral animal control. This will have no impact on public safety.
