Fighting Antisemitism and Keeping Guns out of the Hands of Terrorists and Criminals Amendment Bill 2026.

Dear Committee,

Australia, since early settlement, had to find a way to avoid existing disputes originating in ‘countries of origin’ from coming to our shores. We achieved this by showing that in Australia no one group or religion received any type of preferential treatment by the governments or laws established in this country.

There is no reason for this bill to specifically mention ‘Fighting antisemitism’ in its title or anywhere else in the legislation. There is no reason to give preferential mention to one race or religion in the title of this Act. **‘Fighting Religious Intolerance’** would be more inclusive instead of exclusive wording.

You are in fact, by mentioning only one ‘specific group’, showing a discrimination in this law against anyone who is not semitic.
