RE: Body Corporate and Community Management and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2012

As a long term unit owner in one of the 41,000\* buildings in Qld I would like to oppose the proposed Bill.

## **Current Situation**

**41,000\*** Community Title Schemes in Qld – (Buildings)

130 CTS - Buildings have been affected by the original adjustment order

Unknown\*\* CTS - Buildings have had a reversion to the original adjustment order to bring their fee schedule back in line with the other **40,870** buildings (**41,000** – **130**)

## **My Proposed Solution**

**40,870\*** CTS - Buildings remain as is for now

130\*\* CTS – Buildings affected by the original adjustment disorder be permitted to

re-apply for a reversion to bring in line with other 40,870 CTS - Buildings

130\*\* CTS – Buildings who have applied and received a reversion to the adjustment

order are permitted to have that remain in place for now

**Priority** For government to work on a fair and reasonable solution, within an

acceptable timeframe, to bring all unit owners within the 41,000\* CTS -

Buildings under the same fee scheme.

As the current situation exists now, due to the reversal of the adjustment order we currently have 40,870 + an unknown amount (possibly 130\*) of CTS - Buildings working under the same scheme. The proposed Bill would reduce that number back to 40,870. It is my opinion that this is a backwards step in aligning the 41,000\* CTS - Buildings under the same fee scheme and an unnecessary cost to government.

As a priority, I believe that all 41,000\* buildings need to be aligned under the same fee scheme; not only for the protection of the wonderful communities that exist within some of these 41,000\* CTS - Buildings but for the growth of Qld Business and potential overseas/interstate/local investment. I consider that the current system and proposed Bill affects many people in many different ways and is not a fair and reasonable workable solution for anyone involved.
