I think it would be disappointing if the current requirement for proof of I.D. were discarded as I believe the majority of voters would much prefer to do that and hopefully avoid any kind of manipulation of votes in a fraudulent way. Also, it makes the task easier for the Polling Booth staff to mark people off the roll and have them 'in and out' of the voting centre quickly and efficiently.

I hope that you this procedure will not be discarded for future elections.
