RE: moving the Labour Day public holiday to the second half of the calendar year

The Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union (AMIEU) is the trade union which represents employees in the meat industry – including meat processing, smallgoods, poultry and meat retail sectors.

Origins

The first Labour Day parade was held in Melbourne on 21 April 1856.

Labour Day was first celebrated in Barcaldine, Queensland on 1 May 1891.

Brisbane held its first May day march on 1 May 1893.

Queensland Labour Day became a public holiday in 1901.

Labour Day is intricately connected with May Day.

National Significance

Labour Day celebrates the social, industrial and political achievements of the labour movement such as the minimum wage, 38 hour week, annual leave, through to maternity leave.

Labour Day celebrates the campaigning success of Unions for better working conditions and treatment of workers.

The Labour Day annual procession continues to provide unionists with a place to show their collective spirit.

The Labour Day public holiday celebrates workers' rights across this state reminding us of the accomplishments made by the Unions on behalf of the workers.

Finally, it is insulting to treat working class traditions as if their important dates matter less to adherents of other events celebrated by public holidays such as the Christian community for Easter and our Veterans for ANZAC Day.

AMIEU submits that the Labour Day public holiday continue to be held on the first Monday in May.
