Key feedback

In the course of our human rights activities in Townsville we have been surprised by the number of young people we have met who are unclear about the concept of human rights. Others, who are aware, were surprised that many of the rights they took for granted are not guaranteed in law. We believe the passing of the Human Rights Bill will be an important step in the development of a human rights culture in Queensland.

The Townsville Amnesty International Action group:

- Support the introduction of the Bill as we believe passing of the Bill will provide a fairer and more inclusive community for all Queenslanders by creating an overarching human rights dialogue across all arms of government.
- Would like to see the passing of the Bill as soon as possible to provide enforceable protection of human rights for all Queenslanders.
- Believe enforceability is critical and is needed to create a fairer and more inclusive community for all Queenslanders, and in particularly for people who are more vulnerable to experiencing violations of their human rights.

 support the inclusion of a complaint mechanism in the Bill, and are also supportive of the Bill being amended to enhance the complaints process to include a mechanism for a human rights complaint to be taken to a court or tribunal.
