The new \$533 million men's prison facility will deliver about 1000 beds for prisoners, helping to address overcrowding across the correctional

system.
It will be the first new prison built in Queensland since Southern Queensland Correction Centrestage one opened in 2012.

Outroman opened in 2012.
Minister for Corrective Services Mark Ryan said the project would deliver a massive economic boost to the region, creating hundreds of jobs as well as delivering significant financial benefits.

He expects the project to

Member for Lockyer Jim McDonald welcomed the move, saying while some community members had concerns there would be

significant benefits.
"There were a lot of concerns when the first

concerns when the first Queensland Corrections Centre went ahead in Gatlon and for us all in the Lockyer Valley." In McDonald said. "But we've seen the positive effect that it's had in terms of employment and I'm sure that this extension will provide even further. will provide even further employment and economic opportunities."
