Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Summary Offences and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2019.

I am writing to you to express my deep concern and opposition to these new laws, which are disproportionate, overreaching, and appear to have no evidential basis.

My name is Dante, and I am an Australian taxpayer.

The claims of lock-on pipes as a method of harming police and safety officers are backed by no evidence; your use of dangerous sounding nomenclature such as "sleeping dragon" is a naked attempt to corrupt the objectivity of public perception, made all the more obvious by the fact that the government has not offered a single example of violent use of these devices across their long history.
