Q: Tell us about where you are from, and where you work/play.

I live in West End, have worked in the industry for 20 years and work/ also go out in the Valley.

Q: Do you work in the Industry?

Q: In a few words, explain what role you play in the night time economy.

I own a venue that has live music, craft beer and a youth culture

Q: Are you a patron of the nightlife and don't want to see it diminished?

Yes

Q: What are your positive experiences working/playing in the night-time economy?

It is busy on Saturday nights but struggles for patronage at other times. The support of the late night economy allows for the growth of our creative arts in the forms of bands and live music.

Q: What do you think of the government's major proposals?

- * New last drinks time 2am instead of 5am
- * In precincts, 1am Lockout & 3am Last Drinks (effectively closing time) instead of 3am Lockout & 5am Close
- * No shots or straight spirits after 12am midnight, potentially bans on cocktails and RTDs
- * Pokies allowed to continue to operate after last drinks
- * New bottle shops to close at 10pm, all existing to close at 12am
- * Exemptions for Casinos 24 hour trading (and alcohol served)

I believe this will cripple the late night economy. Perhaps that is the intention of government to reduce expenditure on the health system. The anticipated decline in trade of circa 30% and shift of patrons to other precincts will likely result in our business being closed. The removal of the late night precincts will encourage unruly behavior in the suburbs and regional areas and will be more expensive to patrol, police and for emergency services to respond. Patient outcomes will certainly be reduced by decentralizing the late night precincts.

The compromise of 2am close and option for 3am with 1am lockout in safe night precincts will serve only to confuse patrons and exacerbate issues at the front door.

Exemptions for casinos and special facility licenses will shift Brisbane\'s late night economy to the Queens wharf development. That\'s a good win for government (in 2020) and big foreign business with the extension of poker machine trading, but I\'m in business here, my livelihood is here, my family is here, not in Asia. Foreign investment, while being encouraged, should not dictate outcomes for the local economy.

Q: How would the proposed wind back in trading hours and changes to Lockouts affect you? Would it result in less work/job losses? Would it result in a loss of freedoms? Would it affect your social life negatively?

At the very least, this proposal will certainly result in significant job losses in our business. At the extreme end of the scale all staff and suppliers will be effected to the extent that their incomes will be terminated.

Q: How would the bans on certain types of drinks after 12am affect you/your business/your experience?

This will be a nightmare to manage, a nightmare to enforce and a nightmare to explain to customers/ tourists and international students. I believe that it will only lead to encourage rapid intoxication 15 mins before midnight which is not an improvement in reducing alcohol related harm. It will leave the venues/ security and emergency personnel more issues to deal with shortly after midnight. This is a shortsighted plan from people that are completely out of touch.

Q: How do you think these changes would affect your local area? Do you foresee businesses closing? Do you foresee job losses? Do you foresee opportunities for musicians reduced? Do you think the vibrancy of your local area would be diminished?

As I previously mentioned, this will have a significant impact on the viability of business in the Fortitude Valley precinct. 60% of our weekly trade is from Saturday night after 11pm. Reduce this viability and the business falls flat on its face.

Q: How do you feel about the fact that whilst venues that support youth culture (local bands, DJs, contemporary music) will not be able to serve drinks after certain times, other venues will be allowed to have poker machines running all night, some without a lockout?

In a government budgeting sense, I can understand that pokies make money and lets face it, the Qld government needs all the revenue sources it can get. The reality is though, that these places that have pokies and late night adult entertainment are not involved in the safe night precincts in most instances. This only serves to maintain government relations with the powerful Hotels lobby groups owned by major listed ASX companies. It does not in most instances, affect the ongoing viability of the independently owned and operated venues in safe night precincts who have nothing to do with poker machines or adult entertainment.

Q: How do you feel attending nightclubs and live music venues compares (in terms of social interactions and community interests) with the community benefit of playing poker machines?

I\'ve never played a poker machine and I don\'t gamble as I maintain that\'s not probably the smartest thing to do with my money. I do go out, I do spend money in bars, on entertainment, on transport and food and occasionally I have one too many. Like 99% of the other people in my shoes, I\'ve never swung a punch and maintain my rights to enjoy our late night economy and youth culture.

Q: What are your ideas for better ways to reduce anti-social behaviour and change culture in this space? If you were in parliament, what would you do?

I\'d introduce and fund linked mandatory ID scanners from 10 pm. This single, relatively cost effective strategy will keep the known offenders out and decrease the stupidity of patrons inside venues. More transport options will decrease frustration outside of venues and Uber is already assisting with this issue.

Q: Any other comments?

I believe this is a short sighted attempt to reduce a gaping hole in the state\'s budget. The knock on effect of decentralizing the safe night precincts will increase noise complaints from suburban areas, add to emergency services costs, decrease patient outcomes when issues arise due poor response time and have a detrimental

affect on our tourism, the late night economy and all those people employed in it. The social change required for a reduction in alcohol related crime will not be achieved by these rules.

Q: Do you work in the Industry?

Q: In a few words, explain what role you play in the night time economy.

I am a bar manager at heya bar where we are only a small bar. The theme of the venue is to be an alternative to night clubs and more of a place where you can listen to old school rock, eat some Asian street food, have a quality beer/cocktail/whisky and play a cheeky game pool. We cater to mainly whisky enthusiasts with our secret whisky bar, hospitality staff that have usually finished a long and underpaid shift along with people who want to enjoy their drinks rather than go out to get drunk. We provide consistent service always staying open until 3am with our main trade coming after midnight during the weekdays from hospitality staff.

Q: Are you a patron of the nightlife and don't want to see it diminished?

Yes

Q: What are your positive experiences working/playing in the night-time economy?

Working in the type of bars I have such as this years bar of the year The Gresham and heya bar, I enjoy the fact I can chat to people about their days whilst also having conversations related to whisky. It\'s just so fun to be able to create different flavours in cocktails that cater specifically to what one person likes.

Q: What do you think of the government's major proposals?

Personally I believe that this new proposal will cause more issues rather than solve them as it will encourage more people to drink at home/house party or drinking to excess in a shorter period of time which is far more dangerous. I believe consequences will lead to more public disturbances, less revenue for the government and it will kill the growing small bar culture in Brisbane where there are rarely any issues at all. This law is aimed at

hive nightclubs that can afford a loss and where the culture of drinking is different I just don\'t understand why we have to generalise punishing all bars and costing the industry money/staff.

Q: How would the proposed wind back in trading hours and changes to Lockouts affect you? Would it result in less work/job losses? Would it result in a loss of freedoms? Would it affect your social life negatively?

I work in the industry and one of the perks is being able to network and have an extended family in the form of other managers, bar tenders etc. as a manager it would mean I wouldn\'t be able to finish work early and have a beer before I went home to take my mind off work, it would cost my bar around a third-half of my weekly trade which is hospitality staff, I\'d have to cut hours and staff and the bar probably wouldn\'t be profitable therefore the owners would sell. My days off are Sunday and Monday as are most hospitality staff, in Brisbane Sunday is hospo night where we can all meet and have a few drinks ourselves and given half of our sleeping patterns having a 3am lockout means we can enjoy a full and social evening to let our hair down as Monday most venues are closed!

Q: How would the bans on certain types of drinks after 12am affect you/your business/your experience?

If you\'re a bar tender its your role to ensure people drink responsibly and if they don\'t you have no excuse as we all have to do an RSA course. Banning these drinks like having a side of whisky with your beer (popular after work hospo drink), having any spirit neat (sorry it\'s hard to see anyone going to excessive drinking laphroig 32year old single malt when it\'s \$160 a nip) and cocktails with half of the venues that open until 3am during the week are cocktail and whisky focussed (bars like greaser, cobbler, Gresham, leftys, Bowery, press club and heya bar) just means that these bars can\'t afford to exist and it will destroy the high end, creative and art form that is cocktail bartending. Take away the options then you kill the culture of cocktails and whisky which is not exactly a high risk culture given that people mostly enjoy their \$18 cocktails rather than smash them like vodka red bulls at the met night club. It\'s almost insulting as this legislation is blaming the industry for people\'rs decisions and last time I checked it was a free country.

Q: How do you think these changes would affect your local area? Do you foresee businesses closing? Do you foresee job losses? Do you foresee opportunities for musicians reduced? Do you think the vibrancy of your local area would be diminished?

Brisbane CBD, south bank and west end would struggle but with the areas mainly being restaurant focussed And serving until 11 anyway it would suffer but survive. The suburbs would be hit hard as pubs within reasonable distance for the locals are few and far between, the valley would be wrecked as all the specialty bars and options of venues are mainly there. Nightclubs would lose staff and money but survive however small specialty bars with a cocktail, wine or spirit focus (the other half of the valley and the only half that\'s growing) wouldn\'t be able to compete.

Q: How do you feel about the fact that whilst venues that support youth culture (local bands, DJs, contemporary music) will not be able to serve drinks after certain times, other venues will be allowed to have poker machines running all night, some without a lockout?

Gambling is as damaging as drinking however there\'s no limitations on gambling like there is on drinking. The bar tender is essentially supervising your drunken state until you\'re unduly intoxicated and will not be allowed more alcohol, gambling addicts or even just normal gamblers don\'t have a barrier to protect them from losing everything or getting hooked so I think quite frankly it\'s stupid, dangerous and hypocritical.

Q: How do you feel attending nightclubs and live music venues compares (in terms of social interactions and community interests) with the community benefit of playing poker machines?

Watching a blues band at Brooklyn standard, a punk band at greaser or a DJ at la ruche is fun, energetic and people around you are there for the same reason: to blow off some steam to music they love. It\'s an enjoyable and accepting experience. The poker machines are a lonely experience and I don\'t see the necessity for them but again, we are grown ups and we should be allowed the option.





Laws like these will seriously damage the nightlife in Brisbane, and our ability to market ourselves as an International city.

Obviously this would reduce my working hours by the amount of hours being cut from trading, but on a less obvious front, when venues start to struggle under reduced trading hours (which they will), we will start to lose venues from our scene, which in turn decreases work opportunities whilst increasing the demand for work.

Frankly, the ban on certain types of drinks offends me personally to an extent as there is a removal of choice, and it is indirectly telling bartenders, who are trained in the Responsible Service of Alcohol, that they are inadequate when it comes to deciding if an individual has had enough. Blanket laws are dangerous in that they remove individuals rights to make choices, and ineffective in the sense that they do not take in the vast range of personalities who head out to enjoy their nights off.

I have been to Sydney to DJ in the last few months and witnessed first-hand the shell of a nightlife that used to be thriving. I don\'t want to see that for Brisbane.

I work in a gentleman\'s club, that employs over 40 dancers, 3 bar staff, 2 controllers, 4 security and 2 managers. We will close if these laws come into effect. Many of the dancers come from marginalised communities, are single mothers, or studying at university, or have a disability that prevents them from working consistently, or are victims of domestic violence trying to gain independence from their abuser. We provide affordable, safe adult entertainment for all walks of life, and are the oldest running gentleman\'s club in Brisbane, even surviving through the Fitzgerald Inquiry!!!

I don\'t understand why the government is wanting people to go to the casino and the pokies instead of giving that money to women who need it and will spend it in the local economy, instead of lining another corporations already fat overseas wallet.

Honestly, the owner of the club has told me we will close if there laws come into effect. No question. Its just not sustainable to remain open and employ the amount of people we do with the potential lost tens of thousands per week. I have no idea what I or any of the other dancers are meant to go, as i\'m sure many other clubs will close also. Probably on the dole.

Having worked in the industry for 5 years, i consistently have seen more problems earlier in the night than midnight. In fact, cutting people off creates tension and anger and problems more times than not. Alcohol is crucial to the atmosphere and experience of adult entertainment, and some customers just don\'t want to drink alone and will buy dancers drinks and tip her for sitting and chatting while they drink. That won\'t happen anymore if these laws come into effect.

I am originally from Ingham, QLD, having attended James Cook University in Townsville. After working for a few years in Townsville I relocated to Mackay. Currently I live in London, UK, however my family reside on the sunshine coast and I plan to move back to southeast QLD next year. I have always thoroughly enjoyed a night out, from my time at university to after work drinks with colleagues. I believe that QLD has some of the best nightlife in the country. This ranges from the backpacker bars in Cairns & Airlie beach to spot on nightclubs like Flinders Social in Townsville and The TBC Club in Brisbane.

Q: Do you work in the Industry?

Q: In a few words, explain what role you play in the night time economy.

I enjoy having the freedom of choosing to head to a bar after work to socialise, or a nightclub if we feel like heading out on the weekend.

I absolutely love the nightlife we have in QLD. Currently I am 25 years old and can safely say I have been out well past the current proposed restricted times thousands of times. In all my life I have only experienced violence once, this was at 7pm on a Saturday night where I was king hit in a bar in Airlie Beach. Apparently I looked like someone a few guys were after. Security dealt with the situation and I continued my night. The guys were kicked out and handed to the police. They were very sober, as was I, and it was quite early. The current proposals will have done nothing to address what occurred that night. Queensland may have a problem with normalised aggression and violence, but I can\\\'t see how what time it is plays a part.

Q: What do you think of the government's major proposals?

- * In precincts, 1am Lockout & 3am Last Drinks (effectively closing time) instead of 3am Lockout & 5am Close
- * No shots or straight spirits after 12am midnight, potentially bans on cocktails and RTDs

- * New bottle shops to close at 10pm, all existing to close at 12am
- * Exemptions for Casinos 24 hour trading (and alcohol served)

The entire notion of \\\'alcohol fuelled violence\\\' is farcical. The fact that the government continues to refer to

violent acts as \\\'alcohol fuelled\\\' demonstrates that they accept that the perpetrator of the violence is not at fault. Do not blame alcohol for someone\\'s actions. If a person chooses to assault another, lock them up. Throw the book at them. Don\\\'t throw the book at myself, my colleagues, bars, nightclubs and DJ\\\'s because you can\\\'t control someone\\\'s actions. Do we close all roads when there has been a car accident? No, we teach people to drive safely and wear a seatbelt. Responsible drinking and responsible service of alcohol along with a de-normalisation and acceptance of violence will curb any problems this state has. Not closing clubs and sending everyone to the casino.

It would negatively affect my social life as I enjoy heading to clubs to see touring DJs and bands. If I couldn\\\'t head out in QLD I would be forced to fly overseas or to Melbourne.

It is a restriction of my freedom. I am an educated adult who takes full responsibility for my actions. Please treat me as one.

Because our nights are marketed as a culture and a destination we have rarely experienced \'alcohol fuelled violence\' at our gigs. We give punters a reason to attend and purpose, the communal vibe and atmosphere at our gigs is second to none. People that are 18-21 come for the music, not to cause trouble. We have been working solidly to help build Brisbane\'s vibrant and blossoming music scene in conjunction with several different venues in the Brisbane area.

Speaking as someone in the Music Industry, after recently travelling to Sydney for EMC, it will absolutely crush Brisbane. Not only culturally, but financially. It just seems absurd to act on the actions of a few, when we have a roaring entertainment industry that is making money and creating jobs and culture currently. The fact that the Casino is exempt from the laws is ridiculous.

It would make it hard as a DJ to play out if venues were forced to close their doors. Also, speaking as a Promoter, it will be hard to book more interesting acts, constantly laying my own money on the line if patrons have no reason to head out.

Personally, it wouldn\'t effect me that much. I\'m not a big drinker, however, being able to indulge in a shot every now and again would be nice!

I foresee all of the above! Like I previously mentioned, traveling to Sydney and seeing how one of Australia\'s former Entertainment hotspots has literally turned into a ghost town is very concerning. Don\'t make our already poor state poorer due to bad \'nanny\' policy punishing everyone rather than focusing on the few. Pushing people into unsupervised and unlicensed parties is only going to cause harm and put the general public at risk, it\'s best to provide people with a safe and supervised environment to enjoy themselves in.

This will result in patrons wanting to exit the area quickly and potentially causing accidents between patrons and motor vehicles travelling along the busy roads. It is also likely that these patrons will make their way down to the casino\'s so that they can continue to drink, causing an influx of people for casino staff to handle. With Townsville having only one Casino it will be difficult for the Casino to handle the large number of drunk patrons who will be entering their bars and games room. It is also confusing as to why casino are not required

to make any changes, seems to me that it is because the government makes more money from them.

Otherwise I would not bother drinking at all as it would not be worth the money as I would be required to leave at such an early time. It would also result in less time spent with friends and family that I spend my time with at these venues.

Personally I prefer to drink shots or cocktails on a night out because they typically have a higher alcohol volume. If I was unable to purchase these drinks after 12am I would not purchase any drinks at all. This will have a negative effect on bars who rely on that income.

I believe that some of the venues will end up closing and a large number of employees will lose their jobs because of the changes. 

I play a massive part in the Night time economy in our small town, however we were catering to 900-1000 patrons this time last year on a Saturday night. This year our numbers are 400-600 with local industry slowing down. These laws will further affect the business and might make it unviable.

I have been working in the industry full time since I was 20 and now 38 an owner of a nightclub, I have made so many great friends both the staff I have worked with as well as patrons, hospitality staff are always fun and full of life that\'s why people come to entertainment venues to party with us. Even now on days off I enjoy heading to other establishments and catching up with friends of different ages and staff from my venue. I drink with the deputy mayor, our federal member and many other local business men and women, I help network with contacts and get the benefits of their contacts. You cant get that sitting infront of a Poker Machine that\'s for sure

Q: What do you think of the government's major proposals?

My whole business is based on Night time entertainment. So I don't have revenue from pokies or a drive thru or bistro. I am already required to supply entertainment the entire time I am open, I cant just have a computer playing I have to employ a DJ. People already drink at home and come out at 11pm, so essentially you would be leaving me 3-4 hours to make money on a Saturday night (which is the only night most clubs make money) In my club we offer Karaoke on Wednesday night and a pool comp on Thursday both cost me money but its so

hard to get people to come out mid week in a small town it\'s just about getting people out of their house and keeping staff employed. I make over 50% of my weekly takings on Saturday nights and with these laws you will cut out half the products we as nightclubs are known to sell as well as cut our trading times. and give everyone else that didn\'t have late hours a 2am or 3am lic. Does this mean you will give me Poker Machine Licenses as it seems they aren\'t anti social at all with your new laws.

Q: How would the proposed wind back in trading hours and changes to Lockouts affect you? Would it result in less work/job losses? Would it result in a loss of freedoms? Would it affect your social life negatively?

All I see is that there will be private parties and there will be no one there to, Stop the use of drugs, Provide any type of RSA, Security to keep people safe.

Q: How would the bans on certain types of drinks after 12am affect you/your business/your experience?

You are so focused on the minority you forget about the majority. Last year we were regularly dealing with 900 patrons on a Saturday night, yet incidents were very few. How about using your powers to inforce the ID scanners and we target the problem patrons. 99% of people come out have a great night and leave happy, drink shots, RTD\'s and go home every week never having been in a fight.

I have already cut hours in anticipation of our town slowing down, I have stopped booking interstate DJ\'s and international DJ\'s and told staff they will all loose hours with the change of trading if these laws go thru. I can see lots of venues closing as party goers will use more drugs than they already do

My family has been in hospitality since I was 3 so 35 years, Pubs were a social meeting place now we all communicate thru Facebook, Pubs had bands and nightclubs had DJ\'s and there was enough people to to pay for the entertainment.

There is zero community benefit to playing pokies that\'s why as a good will token sports clubs have to invest back into the community. They are completely anti social and really have no use other than revenue for the government. Send them back to Casinos

Q: What are your ideas for better ways to reduce anti-social behaviour and change culture in this space? If you were in parliament, what would you do?

If we look at this type of anti social behaviour and the introduction of the drug ICE/Amphetamines there is a definite link. Cutting trading time will not reduce violence. Male species in any animal breed fight and to think you can stop this is crazy, You could have all the cameras you like, all the laws in the world, and stop people drinking altogether and they will still fight, over women over money it won\'t matter the biggest and strongest survive, Am I the only one who watches the nature channel?

But the problem we face is people on drugs don\'t know when to stop, or will hit a person without them knowing it\'s coming. When I was young guys would go outside the pub and fight and most times they would come back in a little roughed up and have another beer and let it go. I always say respect is gone because when I was young you called your friends parents Mr or Mrs not by their first name, when a police officer spoke to you, you gave them respect and said yes Sir. People don\'t respect themselves let alone each other now.

My honest opinion is, bring in your 1am lockout so people have to be inside a venue by 1am. But only allow Nightclubs (operating on a nightclub license)to operate after 3am, Increase security numbers per patron on the these licenses after midnight. Use ID scanners so problem patrons can be identified, and come down on those that do cause problems.

This means anyone asked to leave a venue can\'t get into another venue after 1am, but allows patrons that are out for a good time the ability to have one. Having been approved a 5am license earlier this year over our previous 4am I have seen the later trade allow people to flow away at their own pace and Taxis are able to deal with a smaller even flow rather than dumping all the patrons on the street at the same time.

I really feel these laws are a knee jerk reaction and have not been thought thru with the full input from our industry. The people making these laws are so out of touch and have probably not been out after 10pm since they were in their 20\'s.


If these laws come in there will be parties at private dwellings with police stretched across a larger area where they will fail to be able to cope. As the young clientèle wont stop just because you take away the licensed venues. And they are unlikely to stay after 3am and party with no alcohol so will then turn to drugs and you increase the problem. Our town alone has had 4 stabbings this year two of which were at private parties and i\m not sure about the details on the other two to say if they were or weren\'t at private parties.

The benefits of having all the people in a venue means its all contained in one area making it easier for police to attend and deal with, security to maintain order, staff to provide RSA, Cameras for evidence. No to mention this keeps people employed including ME!

I make sure patrons are well looked after, that they are served within legal and ethical frameworks already in place, that the venue I work in is clean and hygienic and safe, and that everyone can enjoy themselves with as little fuss and as few problems as possible.

Until the 10,000th patron/fellow reveller that decides to be a bastard (which is a personal flaw of theirs, not a societal one) comes along, the preceding 9,999 of us are extremely friendly, cooperative and lovely people. Live music is also a staple of the night-time economy in Australia, and is an essential part of our culture. Impinging on our enjoyment of it is tantamount to an attack on Australian culture.

The proposed legislation clearly favours the gambling industry (which could easily be said to damage as many lives as alcohol-related violence), while disadvantaging the live music and entertainment industries.

The punitive changes to lockout and last drinks times would ensure an enormous amount of people being ejected onto the street from venues that have no choice but to show them the door. This will do several things:

- a) swamp existing transport options, including taxis, public transport and private transport
- b) cause a mass exodus of patrons who are disgruntled with being treated like little children told to go to bed. they will mill about in the street, tempers will flare, and violence will spike.
- c) shift partying to outer-lying suburbs, affecting the residents and leading to unsupervised, more dangerous partying
- d) possibly irrevocably damage hundreds of decent, law-abiding and responsible establishments and their employees, all of whom uphold the law and do more to keep violence and anti-social behaviour to a minimum than these \"reforms\" ever will


If we kick them out at 3am every night where are they gonna go? If they are waiting for a bus or train they have to wait to 5am to 6am.







Being a regional town the hospitality and nightlife industries are a major part of our communities lives whether it be the patrons or many staff members that are employed.





At the moment people go home at staggered rates which reduces the number of patrons on the street at any given time.. All patrons on the street at the same time... what a nightmare.

- I myself like drinking straight spirits on the rocks I sip it at a slower rate then a normal drink so I wouldn\'t like that being stopped. Shots however... mixed bag there it could be a good thing and could accept this change however you might find people ordering bulk amount of shots right before 12 just to get them in. You start trying to control people too much then tend to rebel against it.
- -Pokies.... well thats just silly on so many levels and I hope the government has the intelligence to know why otherwise we are being led by money hungry self-agenda pushing ding bats. But if you want me to explain it.... so many people have gambling problems and why on earth would you promote this as an alternative entertainment option. Not to mention that you could have an educated guess that only larger business and hotels have these facilities so it screws small business operators who work very hard to earn a living and do everything in their power to create safe environments.
- Bottleshops, I don\'t have a problem with this there are already too many bottle shops operating per capita and pre-loading is a huge problem to the late night community.



I am a security company managing director with 10 years experience. I am based in Toowoomba, but also service venues in Ipswich and the Sunshine Coast. Q: Do you work in the Industry? The primary reason people are safe inside licensed venues. My company in particular is responsible for reducing incidents at every venue we work at

through significant training programs.

I have seen an 85% reduction in arrest in the last 6 years. I have seen a 40% reduction(greater than newcastle and the cross) in assaults in the last 3 years since the inception of my company. The night life is safer and more enjoyable than it has ever been.

Q: What do you think of the government's major proposals?

The lock out and closing times are plucked out of thin air and have no scientific and evidence based support that cant be shown to be bettered by other systems. For exampled the Newcastle model is actually the worst performing in NSW between 2008 and 2012.

As above, it has no scientific backing and is lazy policy to appease the vocal minority.

This law, I am not so worried about, as long as it is implemented correctly, but currently it is ambiguous and confusing.

Pokies being allowed to operate after last drinks is a simple cash grab by the government, the hamrs of gambling addiction are well known.

New bottle shops to close at 10pm is ridiculous if you are allowing others to stay open. Its disadvantaging some business while allowing others to operate, people will simply go to the later opening bottle shops. Prepare to see the incident rate at Casinos to go up. Again what is the evidence behind this? That Casino alcohol causes less trouble that venue alcohol?

I currently employ 70 staff. It would mean I would have to lay off some staff, including 1 of my full time employees with a new baby.

This is the only way to change the culture, particularly around young men and violence. Shot gun, knee jerk laws are lazy and do not deal with the root of the problem. Alcohol is not the issue, the sooner a government sees this with some clarity, the better off we will be.

I sincerely hope that these words do not fall on deaf ears. I am a 10 year veteran and expert in harm reduction. I simply understand that better solutions are available, if we as a community are committed to putting the effort in.

- Seeing the bands and DJs I love
- Being able to dance and drink alcohol until the sun comes up (which is not taboo in most European countries)
- Meeting wonderful humans and making friends in the early hours of the morning

Q: What do you think of the government's major proposals?

- * New last drinks time 2am instead of 5am
- * In precincts, 1am Lockout & 3am Last Drinks (effectively closing time) instead of 3am Lockout & 5am Close
- * No shots or straight spirits after 12am midnight, potentially bans on cocktails and RTDs
- * Pokies allowed to continue to operate after last drinks
- * New bottle shops to close at 10pm, all existing to close at 12am
- * Exemptions for Casinos 24 hour trading (and alcohol served)

I think that the Government\'s proposals are completely reactive in nature while supported by an extremely poor evidence base. They are a weak end-of-pipe solution to curbing alcohol-fueled violence that are unresaonably onerous on the overwhelming majority of people who just want to drink alcohol, have a good time and don\'t cause any trouble. Considering the economic impacts, I think the costs to Queensland\'s economy through lost wages, less tourism, less hospitality jobs, less live music and lower alcohol sales far outweigh the supposed benefits of reducing the already small number of violent incidents in entertainment precincts. They are a

ridiculous restriction on civil liberties in QLD and completely ignore the cultural underpinnings that result in alcohol fueled violence in this country.

Q: How would the proposed wind back in trading hours and changes to Lockouts affect you? Would it result in less work/job losses? Would it result in a loss of freedoms? Would it affect your social life negatively?

It would result in me seeing less live music due to (effectively) restricted trading hours and alcohol sales. It would affect my social life and mental health extremely negatively as this is what I do for fun with my friends. Overall it is an unreasonable loss of personal freedom to me and that will have a lot of negative impacts on my life.

Q: How would the bans on certain types of drinks after 12am affect you/your business/your experience?

Shots after 12am have always been a bad idea but this isn\'t something government should regulate. It\'s more something people need to discover for themselves.

Q: How do you think these changes would affect your local area? Do you foresee businesses closing? Do you foresee job losses? Do you foresee opportunities for musicians reduced? Do you think the vibrancy of your local area would be diminished?

Yes to all of the above suggestions. Particularly for businesses and musicians. It is so unfair to further restrict opportunities for artists and entrepenuers in this country. Brisbane has a proud music history and being able to play late into the night gets more bands/DJs on stage and getting recognised. Boutique bars and clubs are such a good opportunity being realised in Brisbane. We need to support this economic activity as Brisbane becomes a global city not restrict it.

Q: How do you feel about the fact that whilst venues that support youth culture (local bands, DJs, contemporary music) will not be able to serve drinks after certain times, other venues will be allowed to have poker machines running all night, some without a lockout?

Some of the biggest hypocrisy in these laws is because of the gambling/casino exceptions. It is completely hypocritical of this government to make a proposal that unreasonably restricts alcohol based on the actions of a minority while the exceptions under the same proposal (and indeed other gambling legislation) protect the right of the majority of responsible gamblers to continue gambling despite the (much higher) cost to society of problem gambling that is perpetrated by a minority.

Q: How do you feel attending nightclubs and live music venues compares (in terms of social interactions and community interests) with the community benefit of playing poker machines?

Personally, I see absolutely no net benefit to the community of playing poker machines. I think they are an evil device made to con people into gambling addiction by exploiting reward pathways in the brain. Importantly this does not mean I believe they should be restricted in operation or number because the problem of gambling addiction is a societal and cultural problem that CANNOT be fixed by restrictions on trading hours or the machines themselves. It is the exact same for alcohol.

Q: What are your ideas for better ways to reduce anti-social behaviour and change culture in this space? If you were in parliament, what would you do?

We need policies that target the culture of drinking and violence in Australia, and more specifically, Queensland. Unreasonably restricting civil liberties as seen the the Government\'s proposal will achieve only short term gains without addressing the root cause of the problem. My solution would be to use targeted social marketing and education to change the culture of drinking in our youth. Over time, to reduce the taboo we place on alcohol consumption and celebration I would be encouraging a RELAXING of alcohol laws. This is so that kids are exposed to alcohol in a responsible and fun way rather than as an evil not to be touched or talked about positively until you are 18. I would concentrate on the importation and use in society of steroids as

the evidence for its increase used in society has been correlated with increase in alcohol-fueled violence. There are numerous studies confirming the efficacy of the above techniques over heavy handed, nanny state policies implemented under the banner of \"public interest\". These policies look like they have had great success in Kings Cross and Newcastle. The success of these initiatives seems to be only been measured in quantitative analysis of reduction in violence but fails to account for the negative effects on the night-time economy and social cohesion. These are particularly local issues so even where they have been considered they are completely irrelevant to the Queensland experience.

- 2. Lockouts are the laziest policy instrument you can implement to deal with this problem. Get some courage, take on the hard part and tackle the real issues underlying alcohol fueled violence.
- 3. I have twice been the victim of a one hit punch attack on a night out and I still don\'t support this proposal. I would rather be punched again than see this onerous restriction on our vibrant nightlife come to pass.

Yes


Q: What are your positive experiences working/playing in the night-time economy?
