Regarding the Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Bill 2022 tabled in Parliament by the Attorney General, Ms. Fentiman, I wish to register my concerns about and opposition to this Bill. I believe biological reality is correct - a person cannot change their sex despite the continued promotion from the trans community that sex is a choice. Allowing a person to decide they are the sex opposite to that of their birth should not proceed. As a woman living in Queensland I have not been approached for my opinion on this matter and I question what sources the Attorney General has used to claim this Bill has community support. The trans community has pushed the concept as a vocal minority without proper community awareness or consultation. As the member of several local social clubs I can state that none of the club members I mentioned this Bill to had even heard of it. Evidence exists, without a doubt, that men perpetrate violence against women at an unacceptable level. Men who claim to be women and desire access to women's spaces can still be violent. Women should never be exposed to the possibility of violence at the hands of a man who says he's a woman. Men who claim to be women should not be legitimised by the issue of an amended birth certificate.
