Comments on the Working with Children (Indigenous Communities)

**Amendment Bill 2021** 

1. The ALA welcomes the opportunity to have input into the Legal Affairs and Safety Committee

('LASC') review of the Working with Children (Indigenous Communities) Amendment Bill 2021

('the Bill').

2. The ALA in principle supports the Bill noting that the objective is to provide a new Blue Card

framework that empowers Indigenous communities to make decisions which best serve their

interests in relation to child protection and employment of community members.

3. The ALA notes that the current Blue Card framework and the far-reaching consequences on

First Nation families when a negative notice is issued. This is particularly so in the context of

the Department of Children, Youth Justice and Cultural Affairs.

4. The ALA support for the Bill is subject to extensive consultation with the Community Justice

Groups and evidence of their willingness and capacity to implement the changes. Further,

consultation would need to consider how the decisions would impact the relationships

between family groups within the community.

5. The Australian Lawyers Alliance (ALA) welcomes the opportunity to have input into the review

of the Working with Children (Indigenous Communities) Amendment Bill 2021 being

conducted by the Legal Affairs and Safety Committee. The ALA in principle supports the Bill.
