- **Establish Mentorship Programs**: Creating a structured buddy system that pairs new volunteers with experienced team members could provide invaluable hands-on training and support.
- **2. Increasing Volunteer Engagement and Recognition**

Recognising that volunteers are essential to community service; we propose strategies to enhance engagement:

- **Create Recognition Programs**: Community awards, appreciation events, and partnerships with local businesses to offer discounts and incentives can foster a culture of appreciation and recognition.

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- **Offer Flexible Volunteering Options**: Providing one-time or micro-volunteering opportunities tailored for busy professionals and students would expand participation and inclusivity.
