The media and television in particular, appears to me to be the best form of educating the public.

Advertising by the Government to illustrate people volunteering and the benefits that result from volunteering, may assist in gaining young people to participate. As the volunteering opportunities are almost endless, advertising the volunteer opportunities for families would seem a great place to start. People who volunteer and can include their whole family - partner and children, gain through the social interaction and the family working together. Volunteering often requires time away from families and certainly takes personal commitment.
