Dear Member,

As Publicity Officer for the Blackall Range Woodcrafters Guild Inc (the Woodies), I wish to provide the following information to your Enquiry.

Volunteering has been part of the Woodies DNA since its formation in 1996.


From a very humble beginning in 1996 when a handful of Blackall Range residents met and decided to form a woodworking group to be called the Blackall Range Woodcrafters Guild Inc, when all the tools used, were donated by the members, to today when the BRWG has approx. 200 members and provides a facility for members to enjoy woodworking in 2 very large sheds fully equipped with woodworking equipment, an office building, a solar drying kiln, toilet block, a number of smaller sheds housing the Millers cave, timber storage Paint shed, Wood whiz shed and its own supply of milled, dried timber slabs available for purchase by members. The majority of the above buildings and equipment have been done by members volunteering their time, experience and skills very ably assisted by a number of Government grants.

Members are able to attend the sheds to do woodwork on 6 mornings per week, attend workshops conducted by the Guild from time to time to learn and upgrade woodcraft skills. Open days are held each year when members display woodcraft made by them for sake to the public.

Each year since its formation in 1996, the Woodies have supported the Barung Maleny Wood Expo, and every year during the same period the Woodies have made toys for the annual Salvation Army Toy Appeal. Thousands of wooden toys have been made and donated to the Salvos who distribute them Australia wide to needy children to put smiles on their faces at Christmas.

Two very large projects have been carried out by the Woodies Volunteers – designing and making the front doors for the Maleny Community Centre and also the Mary Cairncross Discovery Centre. Hundreds of hours donated by Woodies members have painstakingly made the beautiful front doors to those Centres and are a magnificent tribute to the workmanship, skills and generosity of the Woodies.





Another significant project saw Woodies members voluntarily converting a mango tree into a Church cross for Maroochydore Catholic Church. Members also made

church furniture including credence table and the kneelers.

The Woodies have voluntarily made and donated hundreds of woodcraft items to many community organizations – see attachment.

The Woodies are very proud of the contributions to other Community organizations and intend to continue to build on our reputation for volunteering and donations.

There are plenty of other files available to be included but couldn't be included because of the sizes.
