***Local Government (Empowering Councils) and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2025***

Central Highlands Regional Council broadly supports the proposed changes in the Bill except for:

**Clause 62 Amendment of section 155 (Disqualification because of other high office)**  
that a person cannot be a councillor while the person is an electoral candidate; and that a person automatically stops being a councillor when the person becomes an electoral candidate.


Council does not agree with the proposed changes to automatically remove a councillor from office upon nomination as a candidate for the Legislative Assembly – noting the *Local Government Act 2009* requires a councillor to take leave without pay for the duration of the period for which the councillor is a candidate for election as a member of the Legislative Assembly; and provides for automatic disqualification of a councillor who becomes a 'government member', that is, a member of a Parliament of the Commonwealth or a State (including Queensland); or a councillor of a local government of another State.

**Clause 66 – Amendment of section 169(a) (Councillor training)**  
Our council disagrees with the proposed amendment of Section 169(a) (Councillor training). Our view is that all councillors, new and returning, are to complete the mandatory training.
