Dear Sir/Madam, RE; CALL FOR A BILL OF RIGHTS

You don't need to have another Bill of Rights, because you already have one. Thus debate on whather to "consider" a Bill of Rights is futile-you have one now.

I enclose a photocopy of a letter from Stephen Coates, Legal Advisor for the Attorney-General, Queensland, that says the Bill of Rights (1688) keeps in force in Queensland.

Under Clause 7 of the Bill of Rights, still operating in Queensland, there is a guarantee that the private citizen has the right to keep and bear arms, which means your government is already in breach of your own Bill of Rights.

You therefore need to act on your own government's breach of its own Bill of Rights and to keep implementing the other provisions of the 1688 Bill of Rights before you contemplate erecting another one. By some strange omission the 1688 Bill of Rights is missing from your Issues Paper # 3, September 1997.

Please let me know when you will start implementing your existing Billof Rights 1688.
