Dear Sir or Madam.

I refer to your invitation for submissions from the Public regarding the matter of the Interim Report of the Consolidation of the Queensland Constitution.

I find your report to be a nonsense, I also find it quite mischievous of your Committee to assume the right to interfere with the Queensland Constitution, the property of Her Majesty's Queensland Subjects. It is also an irresponsible and wanton waste of Public Funds for your Committee to expend (probably) months of manhours, utilizing Secretaries, technical advice, consultants, legal practitioners ect, all at pain to the Public purse.

You then have no conscience, and rub salt into the wounds by expecting us, the Public, for no remuneration, and having the benefit of none of the hereinbefore mentioned facilities to reply to your findings within a time limit of two or three weeks, and compile and write a submission, and post it to arrive within that time limit. I personally find your report and the time allowed unacceptable, accordingly I provide the hereinafter brief submission in point form, that I invite you to ignore at your own jeopardy;

- (1) Alterations to the Queensland Constitution are, when appropriate, proposed by the people of Queensland, and only in that manner and form, who I am in no doubt will advise their M.L.A. if and when THEY see fit to alter THEIR Constitution.
- (2) Your proposals appear to be Unconstitutional to the Constitution of the Australian Commonwealth.
- (3) Your proposals appear to be inconsistent with the provisions of the Australia Act 1986, which is an Act of paramount force.
- (4) Your proposals are in contravention to the entrenched Commonlaw and Liberties of the Queensland Subjects of Queen Elizabeth II.
- (5) Your proposals appear to be an act of one or more of treason, treachery or sedition as defined in the Crimes Act 1914, and I recommend your attention to Sec's 24-24a-24aa-24b among others of that Act and the penalties therein.
- (6) I find your proposal to remove Her Majesty's name from the Queensland Constitution obnoxious to say the least, and apologies are in order.
- (7) Would you also propose to change the name of QUEENSLAND, to the name Sovereignland?
