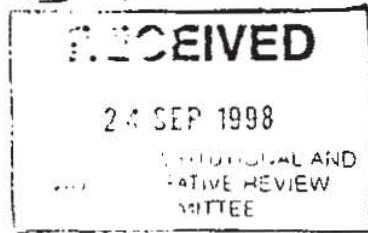

Submission - Consolidation of the Queensland Constitution

Dear Sir/Madam,

To me it seems that Section 53 of "Constitution Act 1907-1908" which states "A Bill...that provides for...alteration in the office of Governor or...in any way affects any of the following sections of this Act...shall not be presented for assent...unless it has first been approved by the electors..." prevents a change in the location of the Act in which it is located. To me it appears that without a referendum the Section referred to in Section 53 must remain in "Constitution Act 1907-xxxx"

If any of those sections are moved to an Act which has a different title then it has an affect. If I move my house from my block to the block next door there is an affect my address will be different. Likewise moving section out of the one Act to another has an affect, it changes the equivalent of the address and so I argue it must only be done with approval of a referendum.
