Issue 11. Are there sufficient controls upon the use of how-to-vote cards?


The Townsville City Council requests that consideration be given to the banning of political propaganda distribution and the soliciting of votes within 200 metres of a polling place on polling day.

If the above request was accepted, it is suggested that each candidate be allowed "How to Vote" cards of uniform size for display under clear glass or plastic in each booth, under the control of the Returning Officer.
