The University of Queensland has had a strong working relationship with the CCC for many years. We have held a Section 40 Direction since 2018 which has been helpful in managing our legislative reporting obligations. The CCC has for many years provided guidance through its publications, training and outreach programs. Whilst the CCC continue on their renewal program there has been apparent reduction in visible and tangible corruption prevention activities.
