I beg you to make decent compensation for ALL taxi Industry owners. Government owes its

pensioner owners, its older owners who now have to continue working (if they can) like me, it owes to every owner without discrimination – We are not multi-national bigtime companies who can withstand this very real capital loss, we are Mums and Dads trying for a fair go under Governments' direction and promise for the future. When promises are broken there is a price to pay and the very least price is to compensate for peoples immediate losses.
